THE START UP

The beginning of the New Apostolic Church in the Philippines dates back to the world-wide missionary movement of the **New Apostolic Church Canada**, launched by **District-Apostle Michael Kraus**.

1972, Herbert Pache, a Canadian who lived in Japan arrived in the Philippines with a mission. To find interested souls he thought he has to attract people by an unusual behavior, so he sat in a black suit in Luneta Park. Indeed, very unusual considering the tropical heat. The attraction worked and he got attention by curious people, resulting in a first contact with **Carlos Gayon**, whose family were the first to join and sealed at the occasion of the visit of then **Apostle Erwin Wagner** and Carlos Gayon ordained Priest. The first step was made. A year later the **Eguia family** joined and a first congregation in Sampaloc (Metro Manila) was founded.

Recognizing the potential in this Christian country Herbert Pache was commissioned to move with his wife to the Philippines. They started to expand the work and eventually, meanwhile a District-Elder, he become the first District-Rector in Asia (except Indonesia).



A few years later a Swiss tourist met **Virgil Fuentes**, on a ship from Tagbilaran to Cebu und thus the testimony reached the Visayas. First Missions could be established in Bohol with Brothers **Francisco Caderao**, **Jessie Bernido** and **Perfecto Mumar**. Japan based Priest **Urs Hebeisen** (initially ordained for Taiwan and Hong Kong) was sent for the promotion of the Bohol Mission but also to start priestly pastoral care.

The term "**District-Rector**" was used for the registration of the Church as a corporation sole, a unique legal construct patterned from the Catholic and other Churches in the country. A status which various lawyers in Switzerland and Canada examined but maintained until today. 2018 the National Council with the Apostles in the Philippines was to be added.







With the visit of **Ap. Erwin Wagner** in December 1979 the movement gained enormous momentum. Over 100 souls were sealed, numerous Deacons and Priests ordained and a first structure of a network of congregations was established in Bohol. Needles to mention a very intensive missionary and pastoral activity started.

The visions and zeal of **DA. Michael Kraus** and **Ap. Erwin Wagner** motivated and energized all, leading to a fast growth. Every year the visit of the Apostle brought rich harvest. In the meantime, faith spread to the island of Negros and later to Mindanao.

The membership in the Philippines grew rapidly and more souls were eager to join and follow. Early 1982 the Apostles **Ernest Vovak** and **Bert Woll**



from the USA respectively Canada was sent on an extensive sealing trip leading to the decision to move **Urs Hebeisen** (meanwhile District Evangelist in Hong Kong) to the Philippines, in even great membership, the church. Later in the year, on 12th December 1982 he was ordained an Apostle and thus the Apostolate had its first resident in the Philippines.



This was preceded by another visit of **Ap. Erwin Wagner**. Unforgotten remains the stormy night in Santa Cruz Laguna. In a divine service dozens of clergy men of the **Philippine Church for Christ** under the leadership of **Rev. Rana** converted to the new apostolic faith, were sealed, and become Priests.

This rather unusual development resulted in even greater membership the church embarked however also on a rocky path facing internal controversy, but it was worthwhile. The first Apostles came out of this group as well as today's third generation members among them **Ap. Leonilo Desoloc**.

THE YEARS OF GROWTH

The establishment of the Church was embedded in a strategy to introduce the Apostle's doctrine to the Christian communities and has proven very successful. All church leaders in the country were addressed a MANIFESTO written by **DA. Michael Kraus**

Already at the very early stage the need for local Apostles became evident and over the years **14 Apostles** with Philippine nationality were called to serve, to establish new congregations and to care for them.



There was no limit to growth. This was also due to the prevailing social and political situation. People were full of hope for a better future. The political leadership, dictatorial in nature, granted almost unlimited freedom to religious organization. Churches were the place of hope and very attractive until the so-called People's Power Revolution (22 to 25 February 1986) a non-violent civil resistance and beginning of democracy.

Due to enormous growth not just in members but congregations spreading all over the nation, leadership was needed, and newly ordained Deacons and Priests were to be cared for. A massive program of seminars and teaching



was launched. Numerous brothers at times up to eight were sent to the Philippines from Canada to consolidate and support the work, mainly to bring up brothers.

Among them the **Bishop Peter Esser** who dedicated over two decades to the missions in the Philippines. **Ev. Fred Altvater, Ev. Ron Sigmund, DEv. Carl Scheid, DEv. Yorck Lindner, Bh. Alex Klein,** to mention just some.

Then there was **William Scott** a US based retired Deacon who was ordained Evangelist just for the Philippines. Hongkong based Swiss **Ev. Mario Keller** and for a short while **Pr. Michael Chapman** (Canada), **Pr. Steve Pathman** (USA), **DEv. James Eyermann** (USA) and **DEv Nelson Kraus** later Apostle in Canada were part of the Mission support team.





CONSOLIDATION

The District of Canada, as called in those days, through its subsidiary "NAK-Foreign Extension" invested considerable funds into a Church Building program. The famous "1000-Dollar-Chapel" initiative was successfully implemented also in the Philippines. The scope was to build small presentable chapels, not much exceeding the standard of its neighborhood. Risk could be taken when landownership could not be secured or were in question. Land for this program was donated yet legally not really. It was also a perfect adjustment to the changing size or even existence of congregations. Everything was so fluid in certain regions. Over time Central Churches were built and became hubs for a certain region, often such facilities serve also as residence for Apostles or Bishops.

Administration especially finances are up to this day handled by **Mr. Ramil Santos**, a mandate dating back to the days of **DA. Michael Kraus**, who in 1984 also initiated the startup of a company (STAMM International Inc.) another unusual and unprecedented step which prompted **CA. Hans Urwyler** to make mention of it in the weekly Telex-circular to all Apostles. The idea to use a commercial entity to handle church affairs in the missionary countries worked well but had as such no sustainable future.

Then another big step. After 2 years of planning the DA Kraus approved the purchase of prime land in Bangkal/Makati and construction of today's prestigious Makati Church, dedicated in 1994. Simultaneously the church also established its own administration office which in later years assumed district responsibility for the





newly established District-Apostle area South-East-Asia, short-named NACSEAsia. 2008 the Office got a new 3 story building.

Since administrative independence with own staff came, somehow late membership records developed increasingly into a challenge but after a time of consolidation and corrections of statistical errors there were 50'000 souls registered.

The Philippine society developed further and in urbanized areas a re-markable economic growth became evident causing a massive migration from the rural areas to the cities where especially young people found better education and jobs.

This caused some drain to many congregations however at the same time also promoted the development of congregations in the cities. Job opportunities abroad also contributed to migration and overall, the church was shrinking yet became more solid which could be observed especially during covid time where all districts had to operate and maintain themselves.

Mission induced growth slowed but the high birth rate continued. Expansion flattened due to urbanization, demographic developments, and general liberalization of society.









TODAY AND ONWARD...

Bishop Samuel Tansahtikno moved to the Philippines early 2018 and prepared for succession to assume national rectorship.

On 18 November 2018, **DA. Urs Hebeisen** entered retirement and **CA. Jean Luc Schneider** entrusted **Ap. Edy Isnugroho** with District Apostle's responsibility and **Samuel Tansahtikno** was ordained Apostle.

At the occasion of the CA. Jean Luc Schneider's visit this 15th October 2022, the church celebrates **50 years** in the Philippines.































WITH LOVE AT WORK

The first humanitarian action on record at NAC Philippines dates back to 2006. After a natural disaster the DA. Michael Kraus initiated the distribution of food packs to affected congregations.

When the deadliest Tsunami ever, hit Thailand on 26th December 2004 a wave of solidarity went all over the world and there were funds at disposal as never before. We realized that relief activities have to be organized properly and are not just occasional actions. NACSEARelief as an initiative of the NAC Philippines came into being and on 11th April 2011 an organization was registered which is independent from the New Apostolic Church yet patterned after other similar set ups worldwide. The close connection with NAC Philippines was maintained because the pastoral network of the church (and other churches, too) is used to reach out to the population in need. The registered name NACSEARelief stands for New Apostolic Church Southeast Asia however outreach is now limited to the Philippines.

Today, **NACSEARelief** understands its mandate as the social responsibility service provider of the New Apostolic Church in the Philippines in particular and as a community service provider in general. Activities focus on Education in remote rural areas where school infrastructure is lacking and Scholarships for deserving students, outreach to humans in need as well assisting in relief, rehab and reconstruction after natural disasters without racial, religious, social or political biases.





HUMANITAS

Management is the responsibility of a Board of Trustee consisting presently of following members: Urs Hebeisen (President), Freddy Nuyad (Mindanao), Siegfred Catan (Visayas), Kurt Brenner (Switzerland), and Mabelle Bagtas (Corporate Secretary) who also serves as the Manager of Operations and supervises the projects in the various provinces of the Philippines.



Volunteer collaboration of **NAC Admin Staff** as well as the pastoral network is of great value in all undertakings. Ruth Moring handling accounting and Genalyn Mosura Rueger serving as Executive Secretary.

With the help of **UNFRIED STIFTUNG** in Germany presently 100 students are supported in their education. Infrastructure projects have been realized by NAK-Humanitas of Switzerland. Natural disaster response and relief is made possible by nak-karitativ and Humanaktiv from Germany yet even smaller contribution from private donors go a long way and have already often made a difference in the life of people in difficult situations.



Accomplished projects are published regularly on the NACSEARelief website as a way of public accountability.
